# Principal's Message

December marks both the end of the 2024 calendar year and, with the season of Advent, the beginning of a new liturgical year and the Gospel of Luke.

On December 24, Pope Francis will open the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica to usher in the beginning of the Jubilee Year. The Jubilee of Hope will take place from December 24, 2024 - Christmas Eve to January 6, 2026, the feast of the Epiphany.

The Jubilee Year is especially connected to the Holy Doors in all of the papal basilicas in Rome, which are bricked up in between jubilee years and only opened for these special periods, when prayerful pilgrims have the opportunity to gain special blessings (called indulgences) for themselves and their loved ones.

In total, there are seven Holy Doors around the world. Four in Rome, one in Spain, one in France and one in Quebec City at Notre-Dame de Québec Cathedral-Basilica.

In keeping with our promotion of our Catholic identity, Pope Francis encourages us to place Jesus Christ and the teachings of the Catholic church at the centre of our Pilgrims of Hope journey during this Jubilee Year. To be pilgrims, represents our journey in this life as we connect to our faith and relationship with Christ. We are called to "pilgrim" with one another building relationships of love, peace, and our solidarity towards each other. Hope is found through the actions of those who Pilgrim following Jesus' example. God's Pilgrims bring communities hope, peace and strengthened faith.

As a major part of each Jubilee Year, themes of social justice are prominent, and thus we invite our school community to journey with us in supporting those who may be struggling this season. St. James has connected with schools in the Dufferin Peel Catholic District School Board to help families in need during this Advent season. We hope, with your support, we can alleviate some of the stress felt by these families. Please consider donating gift cards. Our goal is for each class to support one family. All classroom teachers will be collecting gift cards until Friday December 13th.

We look forward to our Christmas Concert scheduled for December 18. Students from FDK to Grade 6 will be performing in the Christmas concert. In the spirit of helping others, the Grade 7 & 8 students will be hosting a Christmas Craft Marketplace to raise funds for charity. # **Kindergarten Registration for the 2025-2026** school year is now open



Kindergarten registration for the 2025-2026 school vear at Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board (DPCDSB) schools is now open. DPCDSB offers the Kindergarten program in 125 Catholic elementary schools in Mississauga, Brampton, Caledon, Bolton and Orangeville.

Parents/guardians can register online at dpcdsb.org. for all home schools. St James CGLC, a regional IB programme registration will take place January 13th to 16th. As there are limited spots, families are encouraged to register at the home school first.

Registration is open to Catholic children and children of Catholic parents. Kindergarten students must be at least four (4) years of age by December 31st, 2025.

The following documents are required to complete the registration process:

- Proof of age of the child
- Original Roman Catholic baptismal certificate (for child and/or parent/guardian) or original baptismal certificate from a church in full communion with the Holy See of Rome or an Eastern Catholic Church.
- Immunization Reference #'s from the local Public Health Unit
- Proof of Canadian citizenship or permanent resident status
- Proof of home address
- Proof of English Separate School Support

# **Please Label Belongings**

Please label your child's belongings so that when hats, mittens, gloves, boots or jackets go astray they can be found. Many young children have similar belongings and we want to ensure that your child has their own boots and clothing.

#### Winter Wear

Please ensure that the snow pants and gloves/mittens that your child is wearing are water resistant as many students come back into class with wet clothing. In some cases the items do not have an opportunity to dry before the student goes back out for recess. Having an extra pair of gloves/mittens is advisable.

# **Cold Weather Temperatures**

The Dufferin-Peel C.D.S.B. in consultation with Peel Health has developed guidelines for periods of extreme weather conditions. At rest, an unprotected person is able to maintain their core body temperature until the temperature falls to or below minus 25 degrees Celsius. Someone who is protected by clothing or is physically active may be able to withstand exposure to colder temperatures. Therefore, consideration is given to reducing the amount of time outdoors for children (grade 8 and under) when the temperature is -20 degrees Celsius or colder. When the temperature or equivalent wind chill temperature is -25 degrees Celsius or lower children will be kept indoors.

# **Inclement Weather Procedures**

If school buses are cancelled in a specific zone or in multiple zones, the school will remain open in that zone. St. James is in zone 1. Although St. James does not have busing, when busing is cancelled to zone 1 we will remain open. There is no distribution of learning devices in anticipation of inclement weather-related bus cancellations. For students unable to attend in person, no remote access to the classroom will take place. Students may access the Learning Management System (LMS), if they choose to.

If there is a full system closure, where all DPCDSB schools and facilities are closed to students and staff, there is no switch to synchronous learning for the day. Students may access the Learning Management System (LMS), if they choose to. The decision to cancel will be posted on the Dufferin Peel Board website: dpcdsb.org. This board decision is normally made by 7:00 a.m.

# (PYP) The Primary Years Programme

In November's newsletter, we explored a few foundations of the Primary Years Programme - *transdisciplinary learning* that focuses on conceptual understandings across various subjects, as well as the 6 broad themes covered in PYP classrooms throughout the school year.

#### The 6 Transdisciplinary Themes:

Who We Are Where We Are in Place and Time How the World Works How We Organize Ourselves How We Express Ourselves Sharing the Planet

At the heart of each transdisciplinary unit is a *central idea*; students explore the central idea through the lens of various subjects. Our Ontario curriculum expectations are woven into these themes.

This month, let's take a closer look at what a unit of inquiry looks like under one theme - let's take a peek inside our wonderful Kindergarten rooms!

## Classroom Spotlight: FDK A and FDK B

Both of our Kindergarten classes recently completed their unit of inquiry under the transdisciplinary theme: Where We Are in Place and Time. In this unit, students explored the following central idea through a variety of learning experiences: people grow and change over time.

The inquiry based learning that unfolds in our PYP classrooms encourages many hands-on learning experiences and real-world applications. # **December Feature: Community Projects**

As a core component of the IB Middle Years Programme, Year 3 students are required to complete a Community Project. One of the main goals of the Community Project is to engage students in a sustained, self-directed in-depth inquiry with a global context and exploration point. The project consists of three main parts: the process journal, participation in service as action and the final presentation.

This extensive project is a unique opportunity for students to showcase their skills, strengths, and passions as they develop into independent lifelong learners. The intentions of the project are to allow students to apply and develop their approaches to learning skills (ATL's) as well as learner profile attributes for the benefit of others. This project also provides students with an opportunity to increase awareness of needs in various communities and act through service. Students will also generate creative new insights and develop deeper understandings through in-depth investigation. Each group of students selects a topic that they are passionate about and acknowledges a need to draw awareness to it throughout the St. James C.G.L.C community. Through the Community Project, students have the forum to act through service and bring their concerns and interests to light. Students may raise awareness about an issue, volunteer time, or raise funds for a cause. Project proposals have been approved, conceptual questions have been formulated, and students are in the process of gathering their research and carrying out their plan. In some cases, groups have already completed part of their action piece through community outreach and morning announcements.

Once again there are many excellent project ideas that are current, relevant, and drawing on many strong personal connections. The list of topics include: Supporting Canadian Food For Children, Helping those less fortunate through St. Vincent de Paul, Teaching children about active living through sports, Cyberbullying, World Wildlife Fund, Water pollution, and Deforestation.
